



## **RACER Trust Environmental Update Thursday, August 9th at Lansing Sexton High School**

The Revitalizing Auto Communities Environmental Response (RACER) Trust will provide an update regarding environmental testing at its Lansing area properties on Thursday, August 9 at Lansing Sexton High School, 102 McPherson Avenue, Lansing.

The update will begin at 6 p.m. in the auditorium and is open to the public. Attendees should enter the school through the auditorium entrance on McPherson Avenue.

RACER Trust owns several former General Motors sites including Plants 2 and 3 in Lansing Charter Township, and Plant 6 in the city of Lansing.

The August 9th meeting will review findings of environmental testing RACER recently performed in the West Side and Dunnebacke parks, which are located east of Plant 3 and west of Stanley Street. In early June, per a plan approved by the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ), RACER tested groundwater in the parks for per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) that were found in groundwater extending to the eastern boundary of Plant 3.

Additionally, RACER will review the findings of groundwater testing for PFAS at Plants 2 and 6, and will provide an update on its ongoing evaluation of a remedial approach for 1,4-dioxane at Plants 2 and 3.

The meeting will begin with a brief presentation by RACER Trust. Personnel from the MDEQ, which oversees RACER's environmental activities at the Lansing-area properties, and RACER's environmental consultants also will be on hand to answer questions after the presentation.
